


OREGON'S UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WAS 4.1% IN NOVEMBER




CURRENT KLAMATH COUNTY CIVILIAN LABOR FORCE LEVELS NOT SEEN SINCE 2012





November 2019 - November 2024







CURRENT KLAMATH COUNTY TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT LEVELS NOT SEEN SINCE 2008


Health care and social assistance represented 42% of all vacancies, with 25,400. Retail trade had 7,000 vacancies in summer.




ACTIVE AND NEW JOB POSTINGS HAVE BEEN STEADILY DECREASING BUT REMAIN HIGH
