Defining a Green Job



BACKGROUND AND CHALLENGES

Challenges:

- Defining exactly what makes a job "green" is tricky
- "Green" designation doesn't fit into existing SOC codes and traditional data structures

Using Lightcast/working nation's definition:

- Online job postings
- Key word searching in job postings gives more granular data
- Defined different levels of green jobs. My research focuses on the narrowest: Core Green Jobs
 - Directly tied to the green economy (defined broadly as relating to renewable energy production, natural resource management, environmental conservation)




Demand for Green Jobs

Total Core Green Job Online Postings By Occupation in 2024




- Environmental Scientists topped the list in 2024, followed by
 - laborers and movers
 - wholesale sales representatives
 - solar installers
 - occupational health and safety specialists

POSTINGS FOR GREEN JOBS REMAINED HIGHER THAN PRE-PANDEMIC IN 2024



- Postings for core green jobs increased sharply postpandemic, mirroring demand across sectors
- In 2024, total postings returned to pre-pandemic levels

Demand for green jobs remains elevated relative to pre-pandemic levels


Regionality of Green Jobs

For Select Oregon Counties, 2019-2024




- Core green jobs made up less than 1% of total postings in most counties across Oregon






CORE GREEN OCCUPATIONS SET TO GROW QUICKLY
