

OREGON'S UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WAS 4.8% IN MAY.


Oregon's Unemployment Rate Was 4.7% in April 2025 Unemployed % of Labor Force (Bars Represent Recessions)





Oregon Job Change and Average Pay by Industry April 2024 - April 2025 Job Change, 2024 Average Pay



Recent Monthly Job Change and Average Monthly Change Over Last Year



Local Area Unemployment Rates (Preliminary Estimates, Seasonally Adjusted)










L&H, MANUFACTURING CONTINUE TO LEAD JOB LOSSES OVER THE YEAR


Industries Losing the Most Jobs in Past Year by County






MORE CONTINUING UI CLAIMS IN COLUMBIA THAN OTHER COUNTIES IN NW

Federal Government Employment in Northwest Oregon, May 2023-May 2025





TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT DOWN BY 220 (-1.1%)


Clatsop County Employment Change, May 2024-May 2025
