


UNEMPLOYMENT RATE RISING, REMAINS BELOW LONG-TERM HISTORICAL AVERAGES

Unemployment Rate




LAYOFFS UP. QUITS AND ENTRANTS DOWN.

Unemployed for 15 Weeks & Over is Rising in U.S. and Oregon. (U-1)


Employed part-time but want full-time is rising. (U-6 minus U-5).


JOBS IN WASHINGTON COUNTY DECLINING FROM 2023 PEAK






WASHINGTON COUNTY EMPLOYMENT AND WAGE LOSSES

Washington County, 2025Q1: **302,600** Employment **\$1,723** Average Weekly Wage







August 2024 to August 2025, Washington County











Population Change in Tigard








JOB SHARE BY INDUSTRY


Employment Share by Industry







Tigard is a net importer of workers. Of the 44,000 employees, 8% live in the city.













Consumer Price Index

FED FUNDS RATE: THE DUAL MANDATE





Despite inflation hovering somewhat above target,

OUR COUNTY, AND STATE, ARE MORE EXPOSED TO INTERNATIONAL TRADE








LONG-TERM EMPLOYMENT OUTLOOK




Washington County Workforce Aging

Graph of the Month: Nonemployers. According to the U.S. Census Bureau's Nonemployer Statistics (NES), Washington County had more than 45,000 nonemployer establishments in 2023, a gain of about 1,900 (+4.3%) from 2022.

Washington County's nonemployer establishments generated about \$2.52 billion in revenue in 2023, up from \$2.46 billion in 2022 (+2.7%).

Despite having the third most establishments, "real estate, rental, and leasing" was the single largest contributor to nonemployer revenue in the county, accounting for more than \$604 million.








Employment in Washington County reached 305,000 in July 2025, a -5,700 decrease from July 2024.
