


# Oregon Total nonfarm employment

(seasonally adjusted) Official Oregon Series



Statewide, Oregon lost 14% between February and April 2020. It had gained back 111% of what was lost by September 2024 (topped prepandemic levels by January 2023).

Down about 1% in August 2025 since the peak.






#### DOUGLAS COUNTY HAS YET TO REACH PREPANDEMIC EMPLOYMENT LEVELS.

(seasonally adjusted) Official Oregon Series




Douglas County lost 3,880 (10%) jobs between February and April of 2020. It had gained back 3,530 (91%) of what was lost by August 2023.

Down 450 jobs (1.2%) in August 2025 since the peak.




#### MOST INDUSTRIES HAVE LITTLE OR NO GROWTH OVER THE PAST 2 YEARS.

Accounted for 3.8% of all jobs in Douglas County. Compares to 1.8% of all jobs in the state. Sherman County had the highest share at 15%.

Annual average pay in Douglas County of \$89,549 in 2024. About 66% higher than the average for all jobs in Douglas County (\$54,000)

Douglas County's August 2025 rate was 6.1%, up from 5.4% in August 2024 and down from a high of 14.9% in April 2020.

Douglas County's record low rate was 4.4% in November 2019,

Oregon's statewide rate was 5.0% in August, up from 4.2% last August.


U.S. unemployment rate was 4.3% in August, up from 4.2% from last August.



# EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES (U.S. SUMMARY)


- Employment levels were largely stable in recent weeks, and demand for labor was generally muted across Districts and sectors.
- In most Districts, more employers reported lowering head counts through layoffs and attrition, with contacts citing weaker demand, elevated economic uncertainty, and, in some cases, increased investment in artificial intelligence technologies.
- Wages grew across all reporting Districts, generally at a modest to moderate pace, and labor cost pressures intensified in recent weeks due to outsized increases in employer-sponsored health insurance expenses.


## Oregon Nonfarm Payroll Employment Quarterly History and Projection, 1990-2026

Total employment adds 3,850 jobs.


Forecast influenced by primarily by structural growth.
