


Monthly Employment Reports Resume December 10th Revised News Release Dates

In 2013 approximately 1,500 individuals or 6% of the workforce worked from home in Klamath
County. This figure decreased modestly in 2018, followed by an uptick to over 2,200 (8%) in
2023. The share of the workforce that works from home has been stable.

The state and country experienced rapid increases in the share of workers working from home over this 10-year period. Oregon's share jumped from 6% to 17%, and the United States' share increased from 4% to 13%.

- Healthcare & social (16%)

Production occupations accounted for 12% of claims in October followed by office & administrative support (11%) and management (9%). Healthcare support occupations accounted for 4%.



Transportation & Material Moving Construction & Extraction Management Life, Physical, & Social Science Building, Grounds Cleaning & Maintenance

Transportation and material moving, construction and extraction, and management occupations accounted for 24% of claims each in October. Building, grounds cleaning, and maintenance occupations accounted for 12%.
