


Special Topic: Workforce Housing & Vacancy Rate



Revised News Release Dates

The population of Klamath County increased by 4,628 (7%) from 2013 to 2023, experiencing a recent peak in 2021 with 70,415 residents. Housing units during this same time period increased by 277 (1%) to 33,004. The combination of these two factors drove down the vacancy rate from 16% to 13%.


Housing demand outran new supply with occupied units growing faster than new housing units. This indicates absorption of existing housing stock and a tightening housing market post-2018.


Unemployment Rate at 7.2%

- The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in September 2024 was 5.9%
- The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate has ranged from 5.9% to 7.2% over the year

Klamath County employment lost 310 jobs over the year.



Revised News Release Dates

The population of Lake County increased by 507 (7%) from 2013 to 2023, experiencing a recent peak in 2022 with 8,365 residents. Housing units during this same time period decreased by 184 (-4%) to 4,223. The vacancy rate has remained relatively stable over this 10-year period.


Occupied units and total units both fell contributing to a minimal net drop in the vacancy rate. While the housing market tightened post-2018 it's still relatively loose.


Unemployment Rate at 6.3%
