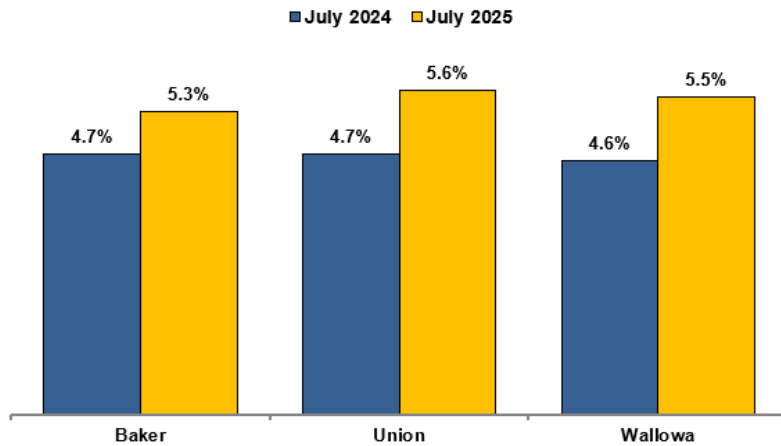


Unemployment Rates (Seasonally Adjusted)

Nonfarm Employment Change

July 2024 to July 2025

Baker County lost an estimated 20 jobs over the year. Both the private and public sectors decreased by 10 jobs each. Private education and health services led gains while manufacturing and federal government experienced the largest job losses.

Union County employment decreased by an estimated 110 jobs over the year. The public sector dropped by 30 jobs while the private sector dropped 80 positions. Retail trade experienced the most job losses. Gains were led by private education and health services; manufacturing; and transportation, warehousing, and utilities.

Wallowa County lost an estimated 20 jobs over the year. Those losses came entirely from the public sector while the private sector experienced no net change. Wholesale and retail trade, construction, and federal government led losses. Financial activities; transportation, warehousing, and utilities; and private education and health services added the most jobs.

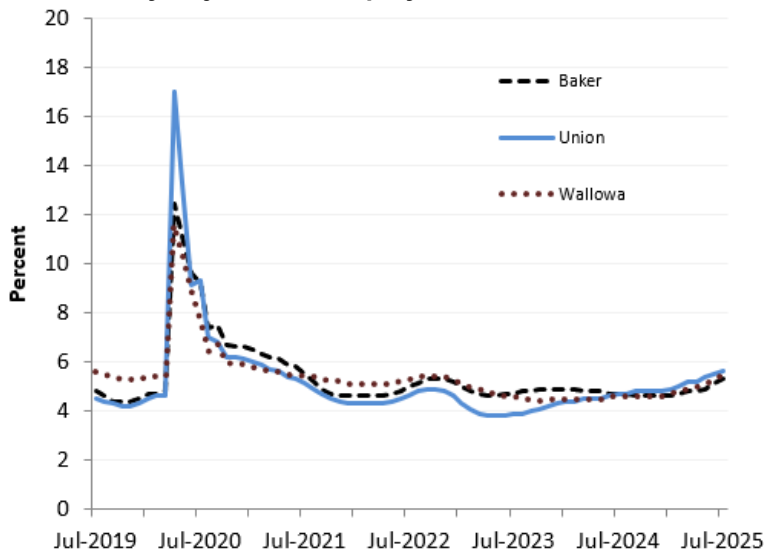
