### Nonfarm Employment Change

September 2024 to September 2025

Baker County lost an estimated 70 jobs over the year while gaining 40 jobs over the previous month. The private sector decreased 60 and the public sector decreased by 10 jobs over the year.



Union County employment decreased by an estimated 120 jobs over the year, but added 80 over the previous month. The public sector added 10 jobs while the private sector dropped 130 positions.




Wallowa County gained an estimated 20 jobs over the year and 30 from the previous month. The public sector lost 20 jobs while the private sector increased by 40.
