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Employment in the Columbia Gorge: August 2025

Seasonally adjusted unemployment rates continued to increase in three of the five Columbia Gorge counties this August.

Hood River County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained unchanged in August and stands at 4.0%. Over the year, the county's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged up by 0.6 percentage point.

Hood River County's nonfarm employment decreased by 70 (0.6%) in August and was estimated at 11,500 jobs. Private-sector employment increased over the month (+80 jobs) with the largest gains occurring within trade, transportation, and utilities (+70 jobs). Within this sector, wholesale trade had the largest monthly gains (+50 jobs). Public-sector employment shed 150 jobs over the month.

Hood River County's total nonfarm employment decreased by 170 jobs over the year ending in August, representing a loss of 1.5%. Job losses were widespread and concentrated within manufacturing (-90 jobs); trade, transportation, and utilities (-50 jobs); financial activities (-40 jobs); mining, logging, and construction (-40 jobs); and information (-10 jobs). The only over-the-year gains occurred in leisure and hospitality (+110 jobs). Government employment saw no change over the year.

Wasco County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 5.0% as of August, up from 4.9% in July. Over the year, Wasco County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 0.7 percentage point higher.

Wasco County's nonfarm employment decreased by 1.7%, a decline of 180 jobs to total 10,240 as of August. Private industry employment lost 10 jobs, bringing employment down to 8,230. Government employment fell by 170 jobs and is now 2,010. Private job gains were seen in private education and health services (+20 jobs) and leisure and hospitality (+10 jobs). Trade, transportation, and utilities; professional and business services; manufacturing; and construction all lost 10 jobs over the month, while all other industries saw little to no change.

Wasco County's private industry employment decreased by 60 (-0.6%) jobs over the year ending in August. The largest losses were in trade, transportation, and utilities (-100 jobs), specifically retail trade (-100 jobs); and mining, logging, and construction (-40 jobs). Smaller losses also occurred in information (-20 jobs), other services (-20 jobs), and financial activities (-10 jobs). Over-the-year gains

occurred in leisure and hospitality (+90 jobs), private education and health services (+20 jobs), and manufacturing (+20 jobs). The public sector remained unchanged over the year.

Gilliam County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased over the month, going from a rate of 4.6% in July to 4.8% in August. Over the year, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 0.1 percentage point higher.

Gilliam County's nonfarm employment remained the same from July to August and stands at 1,000 jobs. Over the month, the private sector gained 10 jobs and government employment decreased by 10 jobs with local government shedding those 10 jobs. Over the year, total private employment increased by 30 jobs while government employment decreased by 20 jobs for an over-the-year net gain of 10 total nonfarm jobs.

Sherman County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate went from 4.4% in July to 4.7% in August and increased by 0.9 percentage point over the year. Sherman County's nonfarm employment decreased by 10 jobs (-1.0%) in August and stands at 985. Private-sector employment declined by 10 jobs while public-sector employment remained unchanged. Over the year ending in August, private industry added 20 jobs, bringing the total to 650, a 3.2% increase. Public-sector employment lost 15 jobs over the year, representing a 4.3% decrease.

Wheeler County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged from July to August and remains 3.9%. Over the year, Wheeler County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was up by 0.1 percentage point. Total nonfarm employment increased by five jobs (+1.5%) from July to August and now stands at 335 jobs. Over the year ending in August, private industry employment declined by 25 and was estimated to be 175. Government employment also declined, losing 15 jobs during the same period.

Next Press Releases

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the September county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, Oct. 21, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for September on Wednesday, Oct. 15.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
