## Employment in Jackson County: August 2025 Health Care and Social Assistance Adds Most Jobs Over the Year

Total payroll employment in Jackson County rose by 930 jobs in August, largely due to a seasonally expected increase in local government education. Job growth was also estimated in private education and health services (+310); professional and business services (+50); and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+40). Industries with employment loss over the month were retail trade (-110) and construction (-20). Government employment climbed by 640 with a gain of 710 jobs in local government education slightly offset by a loss of 30 federal government jobs.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) fell by 720 jobs, or -0.8%. Since August 2024 industries adding jobs were health care and social assistance (+1,000); leisure and hospitality (+140); professional and business services (+100); and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+50). Industries shedding jobs were retail trade (-920); construction (-330); manufacturing (-310): financial activities (-190); other services (-90); information (-50); wholesale trade (-40); and mining and logging (-40).

Government employment rose by 130 jobs over the year. Local (+210) and state government (+30) have added jobs since August 2024. Federal government employment fell by 110 jobs over that time.

Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.6% in August, from 5.4% in July and up slightly from 4.9% in August 2024.

## Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
