Employment in Josephine County: September 2025

Job Losses Estimated in Most Industries Over the Year

Total payroll employment in Josephine County rose by 330 jobs in September. Local government education posted the largest increase with a seasonally typical gain of 420 jobs. The only other industry with estimated job growth was private education and health services (+130). Employment losses were posted in leisure and hospitality (-160); construction (-20); and local government excluding educational services (-20). Other published industries showed little job change in September.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) was down by 190 jobs, a loss of 0.7%. Employment fell over the year in most private-sector industries, excluding private education and health services, which gained 440 jobs. Job declines occurred in financial activities (-140); leisure and hospitality (-140); professional and business services (-50); wholesale trade (-40); and retail trade (-30).

Government employment fell by 180 jobs over the year. Losses occurred in local government education (-150); local government excluding educational services (-20); and federal government (-10).

Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 7.3% in September, from 7.1% in August and up from the September 2024 rate of 6.0%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the October and November county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, Jan. 13th, and the statewide data for October and November on Wednesday, Jan. 7th. The October employment survey jobs data will be released along with November's data, but there won't be October labor force or unemployment data published.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
