## **Employment in Albany MSA (Linn County): August 2025**

## Linn County's Unemployment Rate Increases to 5.4%

Linn County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.4% in August, up slightly from its July rate of 5.3%. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in August was 5.0%, up from its July rate of 4.9%.

Linn County's employment losses in August were normal; total nonfarm employment decreased by 280 jobs, when employment would be expected to decrease 280. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment was unchanged between July and August. Employment is now 1.7%, or 800 jobs, above the pre-pandemic employment level in February 2020.

Linn County's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment was down 250 (-0.5%) over the past year.

Private-sector employment was up 290 in August. Private education and health services (+140 jobs, +1.8%) had the largest employment gain in August. Transportation, warehousing, and utilities employment added 80 jobs or +2.5%.

Public-sector employment declined 570 in August. Local government employment declined 550. State government employment was unchanged. Federal government employment was down 20 jobs.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
