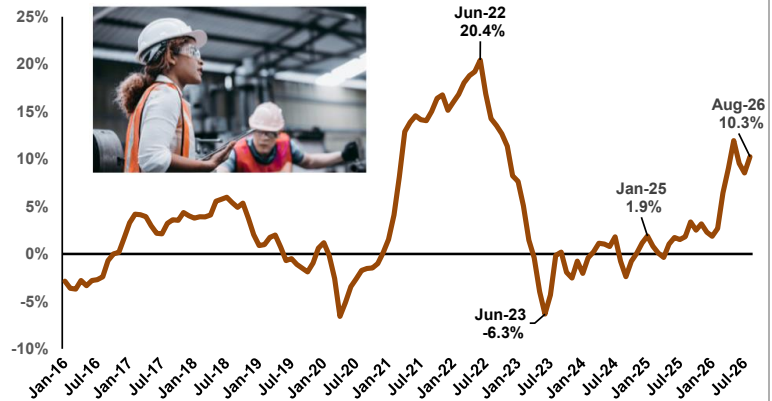

Graph of the Month: The Producer Price Index (PPI) measures the average change in prices received by producers for domestically produced goods and services.

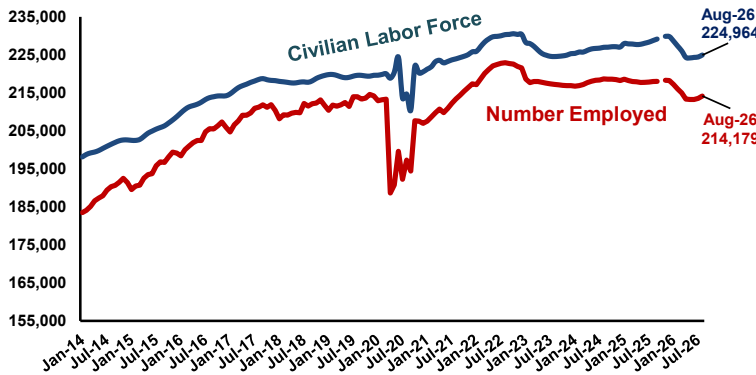
- The PPI measures price change from the perspective of the seller. This contrasts with other measures, like the Consumer Price Index (CPI) which measures price change from the purchaser's perspective.
- The overall manufacturing industry saw its producer price index increase by 10.3% from a year ago in August 2026.

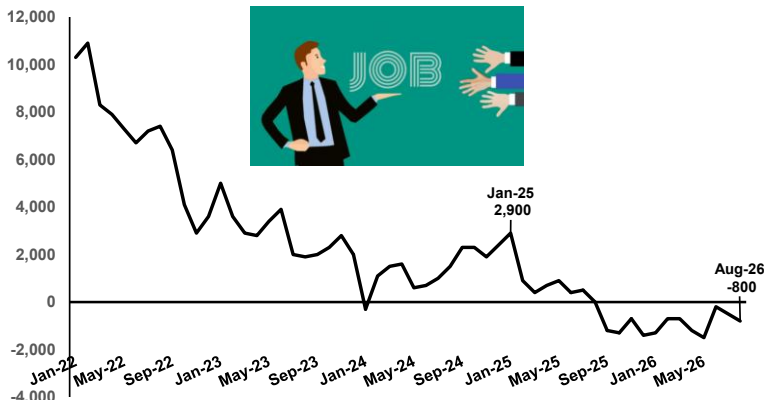
Labor Force and Employment

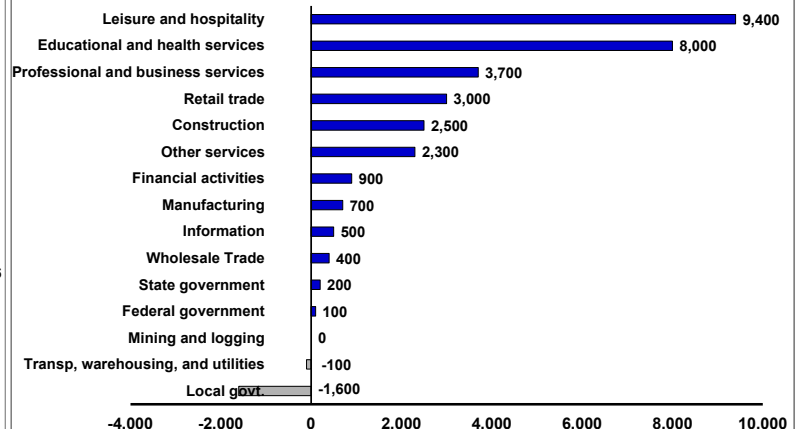
- The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Clackamas County was 4.8% in August – unchanged from the previous month with 10,785 unemployed workers.
- The county's civilian labor force numbered 224,964 residents in August with 214,179 employed workers.
- Clackamas County has added back a total of 30,000 net jobs since the 2020 recession with over one-half (58%) of the job growth coming from the leisure and hospitality and private educational and health services industries.
