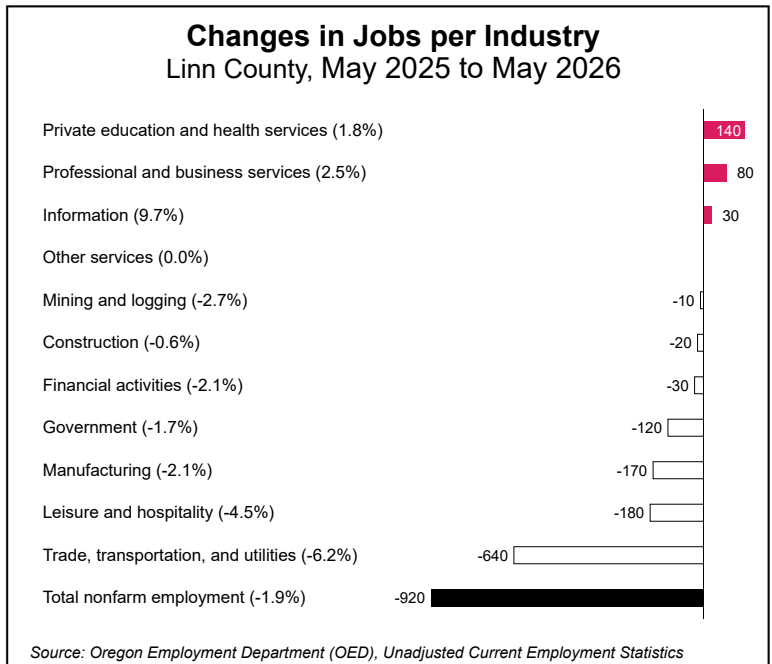
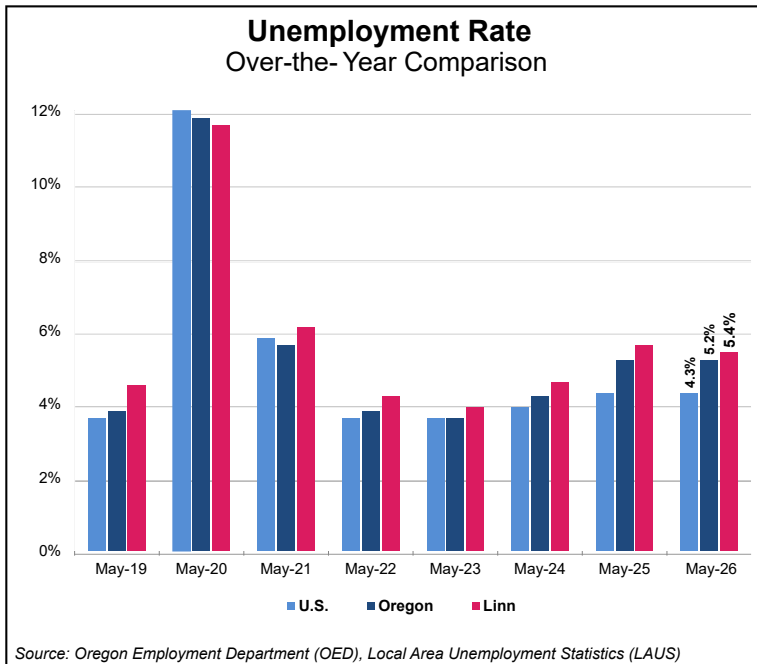


Linn County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.4% in May, unchanged from April's revised unemployment rate of 5.4%. Linn County's unemployment rate has decreased from 5.6% to 5.4% over the past year. Oregon's statewide unadjusted unemployment rate in May was 5.2%.

Employment in the county declined by 920 jobs (-2.3%) over the year. Employment increased in industries such as private education and health services (+140 jobs), professional and business services (+80 jobs), and in information (+30 jobs). Linn County saw declines in the trade, transportation, and utilities industry (-840 jobs) and in leisure and hospitality (-180 jobs).

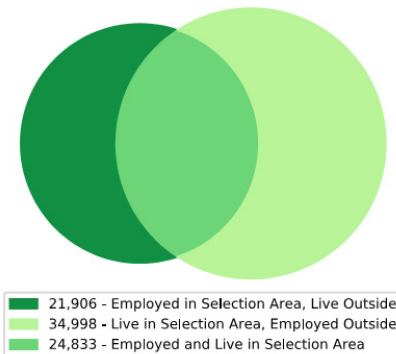
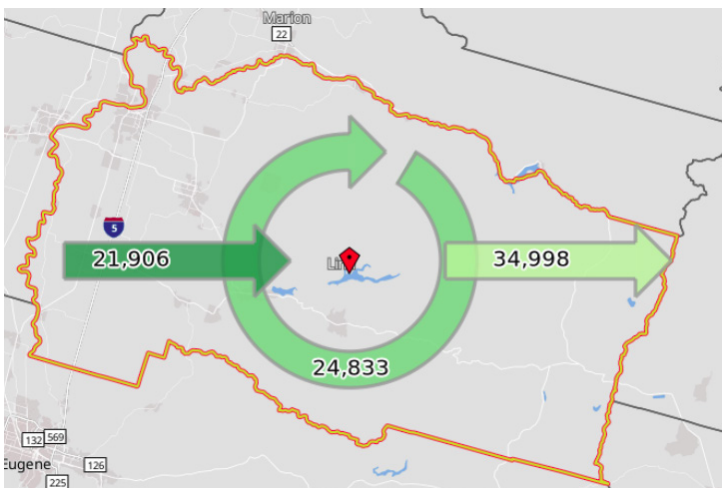
Worker Inflow and Outflow Trends for all Workers in 2023—By looking at the most recent data from the U.S Census, we can gauge the relationship between job opportunities and housing availability in specified geographies. For Linn County residents, the majority of the working population, 58%, live in the area but commute elsewhere for work. Now if we look at the population of people who are employed in Linn County, we find a fairly even split with 53% of people both living *and* working in the area and 47% of the people employed by Linn County businesses live elsewhere. While there is a lot of commuting in and out of the area, the data does not signal a severe disconnect between job opportunities and housing availability and or desirability. This story is similar to what we see in Yamhill County.

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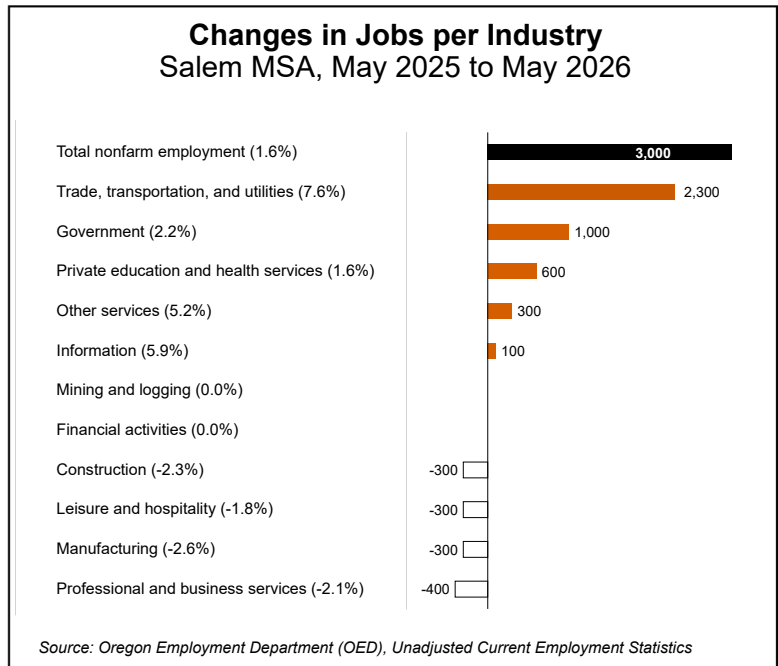
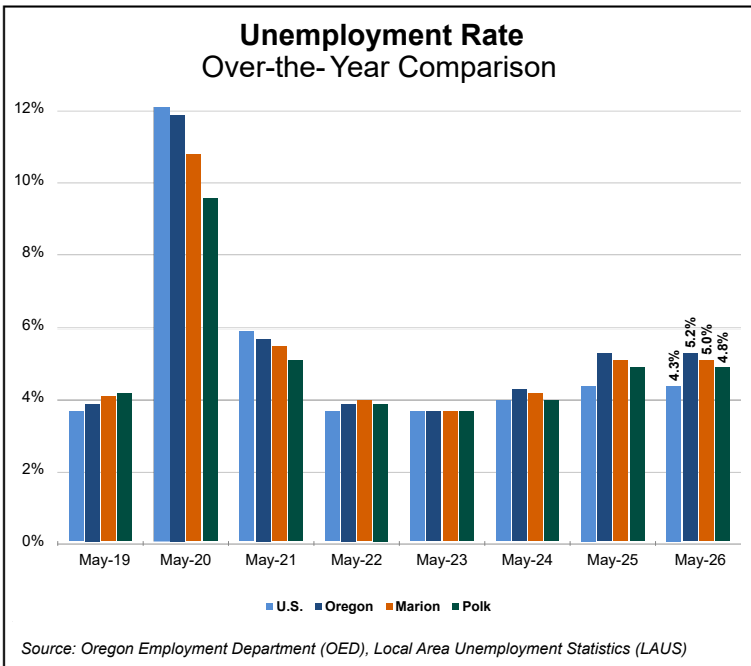
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The Salem MSA's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9% in May, unchanged from April's revised unemployment rate of 4.9%. The Salem MSA's unemployment rate has been essentially unchanged, decreasing from 5.0% to 4.9% over the past year. Oregon's statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in May was 5.2%.

Employment in the county increased by 3,000 jobs (+1.6%) over the year. Employment increased in industries such as trade, transportation, and utilities (+2,300 jobs); government (+1000 jobs); and in private education and health services (+600 jobs). Salem MSA saw declines in the professional and business services industry (-400 jobs), manufacturing (-300 jobs), and in leisure and hospitality (-300 jobs).

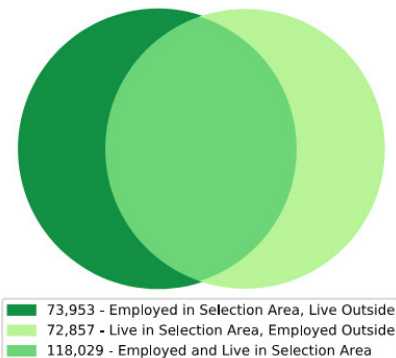
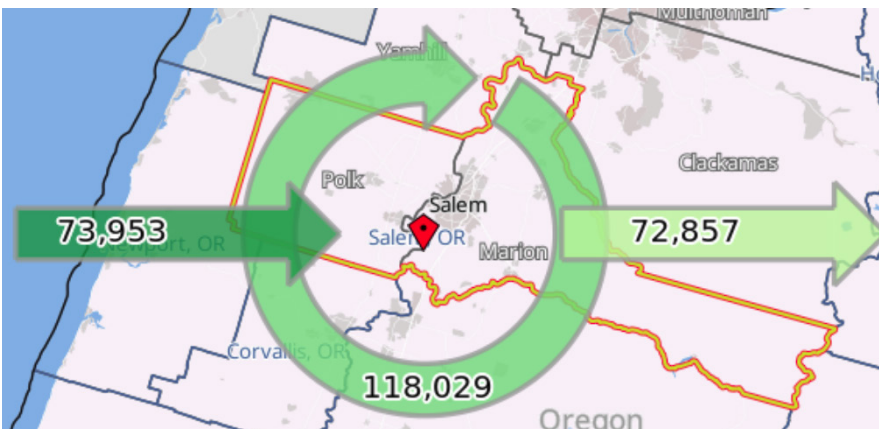
Worker Inflow and Outflow Trends for all Workers in 2023—By looking at the most recent data from the U.S Census, we can gauge the relationships between job opportunities and housing availability in specified geographies. For the Salem MSA, about 61% of people work and live in the area, signaling that the majority of people have access to opportunities for work *and* housing. The remaining 39% either live elsewhere and commute into the Salem MSA or live in the area and commute to other areas for work. The share of people who either live elsewhere and commute in for work or people who live in the area and commute out is also fairly even, unlike in other areas in the Mid-Valley.

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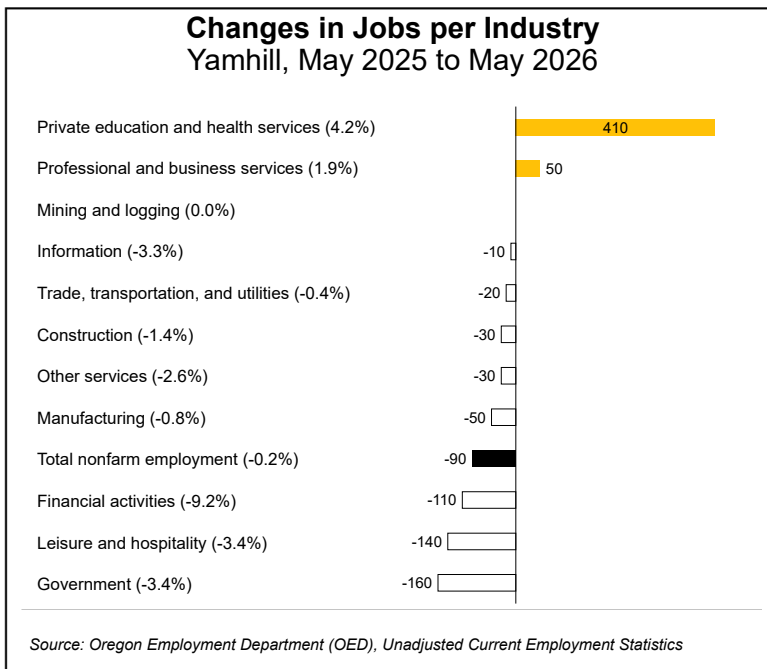
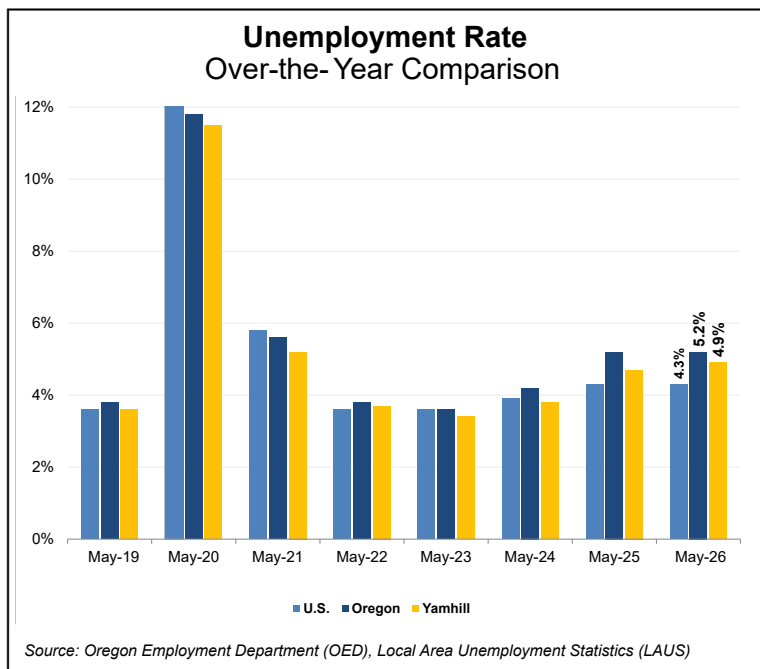
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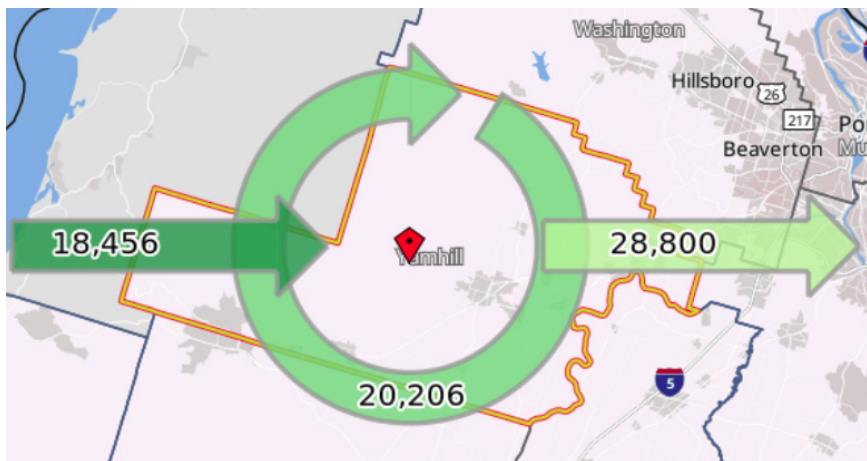
Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9% in May, essentially unchanged from April's revised rate of 4.8%. Yamhill County's unemployment rate increased from 4.7% to 4.9% over the past year. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in May was 5.2%. Oregon's unemployment rate was unchanged over the past year.

Employment in the county decreased by 90 jobs (-0.2%) over the year. Employment increased in industries such as private education and health services (+410 jobs), and in professional and business services (+50 jobs). Yamhill County saw declines in the government industry (-160 jobs) and in leisure and hospitality (-140 jobs).

Worker Inflow and Outflow Trends for all Workers in 2023—By looking at the most recent data from the U.S Census, we can gauge the relationship between job opportunities and housing availability in specified geographies. For Yamhill County residents, the majority of the working population, 59%, live in the area but commute elsewhere for work. If we were to look at the population of people who are employed in Yamhill County specifically, we find a fairly even split with 52% of people living *and* working in the area, and that 48% of the people employed by Yamhill County businesses live elsewhere. While there is significant commuting in and out of the area, the data does not signal a severe disconnect between job opportunities and housing availability and or desirability. This is a similar story to what we are seeing in Linn County.

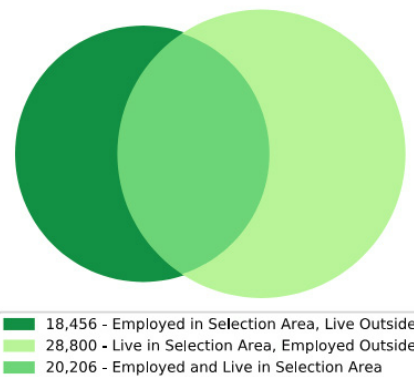


Worker Inflow/Outflow 2023
