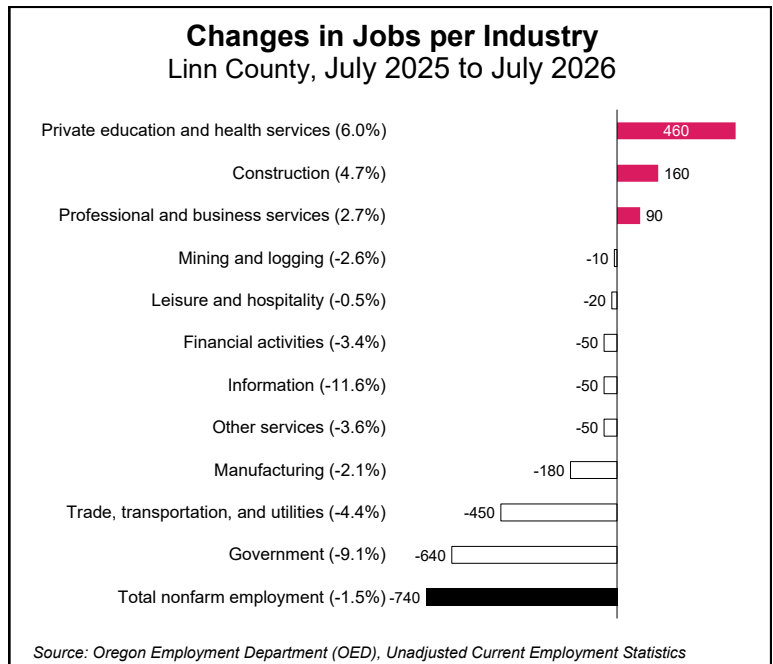
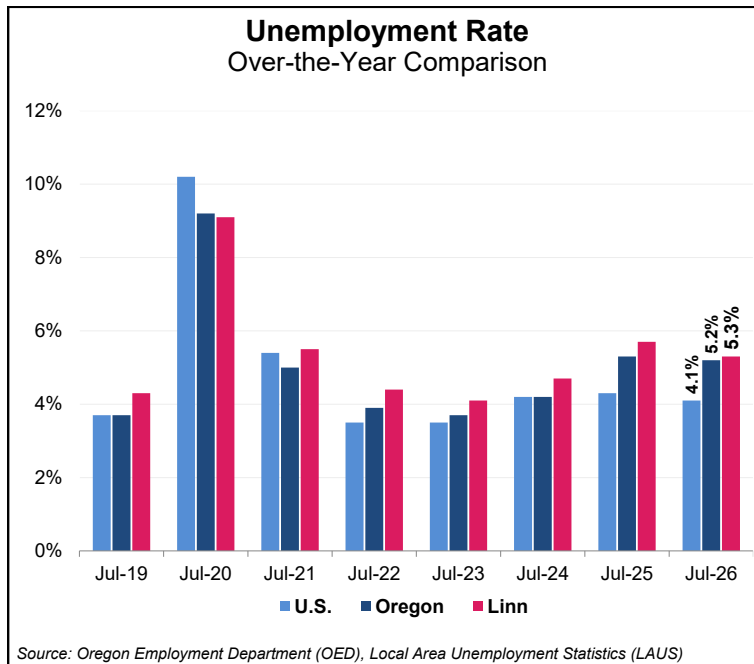


Linn County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.3% in July, essentially unchanged from June's revised unemployment rate of 5.4%. Linn County's unemployment rate has decreased from 5.7% to 5.3% over the past year. Oregon's statewide unadjusted unemployment rate in July was 5.2%.

Employment in the county declined by 740 jobs (-1.5%) over the year. Employment increased in industries such as private education and health services (+460 jobs) and in construction (+160 jobs). Linn County saw declines in government with the summer break in local education (-640 jobs) and trade, transportation, and utilities (-450 jobs).

Age Breakdown for All Industries in Oregon for 2025 Q2 — The table below breaks down the number of employees per age group in each industry. The highlighted age ranges have the most employees. Fourteen out of 20 industries have most of their employees concentrated in the ages of 25-54, which makes sense as that is considered "prime working age". The remaining six industries have an older concentration of employees, ranging from 35-64. Another interesting point is the number of employees who are 65-99, or retirement age. For a few industries such as agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting, the number of employees age 65-99 working is not significantly lower than in other "prime working age" categories.

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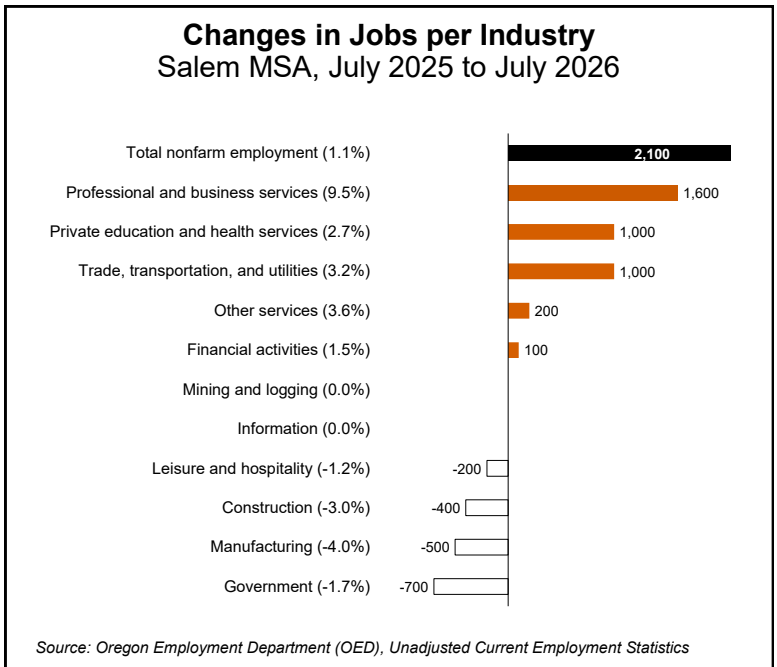
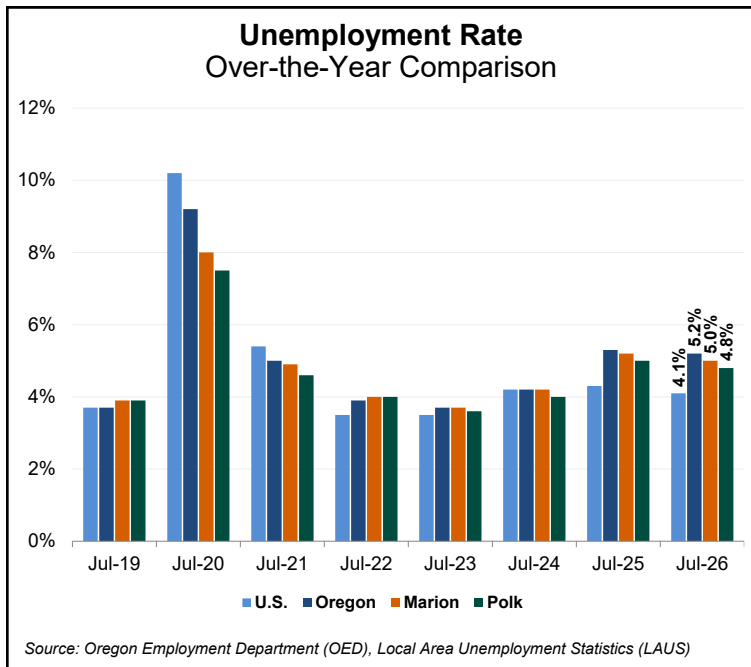
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The Salem MSA's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9% in July, unchanged from June's revised unemployment rate of 4.9%. The Salem MSA's unemployment rate has been essentially unchanged over the past year, decreasing from 5.1% to 4.9%. Oregon's statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in July was 5.2%.

Employment in the county increased by 2,100 jobs (+1.1%) over the year. Employment increased in industries such as professional and business services (+1,600); private education and health services (+1,000 jobs); and trade, transportation, and utilities (+1,000 jobs). Salem MSA saw declines in government (-700 jobs), manufacturing (-500 jobs), and construction (-400 jobs).

Age Breakdown for All Industries in Oregon for 2025 Q2 — The table below breaks down the number of employees per age group in each industry. The highlighted age ranges have the most employees. Fourteen out of 20 industries have most of their employees concentrated in the ages of 25-54, which makes sense as that is considered "prime working age". The remaining six industries have an older concentration of employees, ranging from 35-64. Another interesting point is the number of employees who are 65-99, or retirement age. For a few industries such as agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting, the number of employees age 65-99 working is not significantly lower than in other "prime working age" categories.

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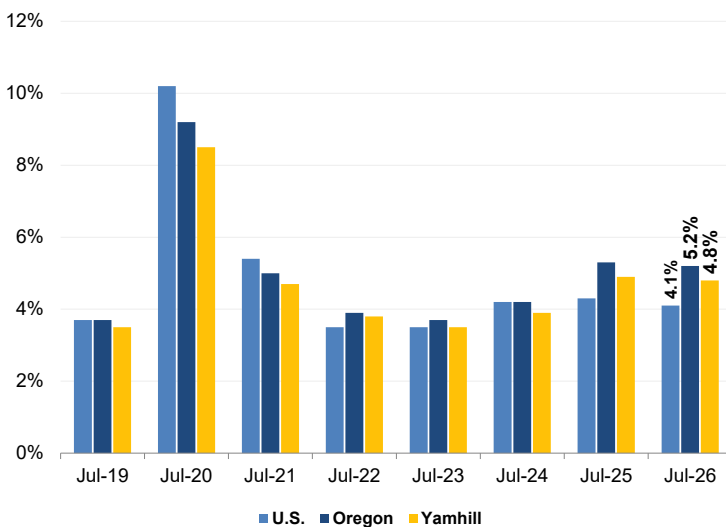
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Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.8% in July, unchanged from June's revised rate of 4.8%. Yamhill County's unemployment rate was essentially unchanged over the past year. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in July was 5.2% and was little changed over the past year.

Employment in the county increased by 180 jobs (+0.5%) over the year. Employment increased in industries such as private education and health services (+530 jobs), leisure and hospitality (+20 jobs), and professional and business services (+20 jobs). Yamhill County saw declines in construction (-170 jobs), government (-100 jobs), and in financial activities (-70 jobs).

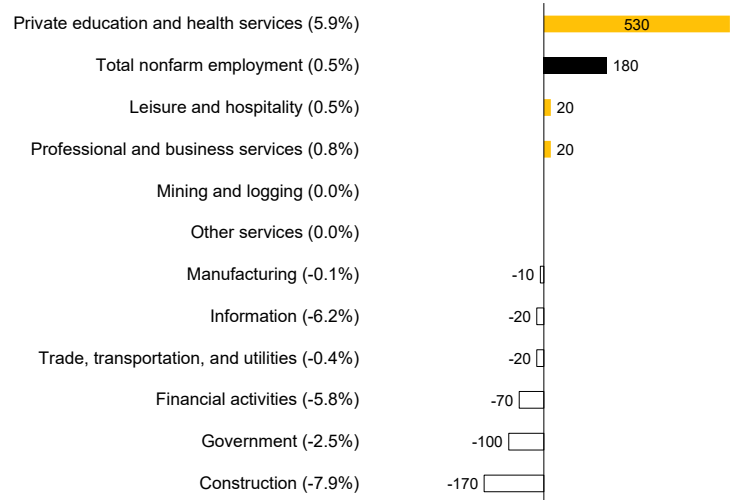
