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Employment in Tillamook County: July 2026

Seasonally adjusted employment increased by 120 in July

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.2% in July, unchanged from June. It was 5.4% the year before. The statewide unemployment rate was 5.2% in July, and the national rate was 4.1%.

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment increased by 120 in July to 9,700 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. Employment was expected to be unchanged, and the county added 120 jobs, with a gain of 160 jobs in the private sector and a loss of 40 jobs in total government employment. Leisure and hospitality added 100 jobs (+6.3%). Local government, including education, lost 40 jobs (-2.4%).

July's total nonfarm employment was up from the previous year by 80 jobs (+0.8%). Manufacturing added 100 jobs (+5.6%). Leisure and hospitality lost 50 jobs (-2.9%). Local government added 50 jobs over the year (+3.2%).

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
