

The Highest and Lowest Paid Occupation Groups by Median Wage





As of this year, the median wage for all occupations in the Columbia Gorge is \$22.39. This means that half of all jobs in Central Oregon pay more than \$22.39, and half pay less than that. The top five paying occupations by median wage have mostly remained the same, with healthcare practitioners and technical occupations still having the highest median hourly wage (\$49.39), followed by computer and mathematical occupations (\$47.53), which replaced business and financial operations in the top five. On the opposite end of the spectrum are the lowest paying occupation groups. Food preparation and serving related occupations are the lowest (\$15.38) among Columbia Gorge occupations, followed by building and grounds cleaning and maintenance occupations (\$16.87), and personal care and service occupations (\$17.34).
