


Graph of the Month

This month we are taking a look at the results of our job vacancy survey in 2024. There was a 21% reduction in vacant positions in 2024 from the previous year. The volumes seen in 2024 are very similar to job vacancy volumes seen pre-pandemic. A typical job vacancy in Oregon tended to be for a permanent, full-time position. Key Takeaways

Seasonally adjusted unemployment rates increased slightly in most of the counties of Northwest Oregon and remain above levels seen one year ago. Benton County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate will be unavailable until June 2025, but the not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is above the level seen last year (4.3% vs. 3.8%, respectively). Not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates tend to be more volatile than seasonally adjusted rates. While health care continues to add jobs in most counties, changes in manufacturing, professional and business services, and leisure and hospitality have risen to the top of list across much of the region. Manufacturing employment has decreased notably in Benton and Lincoln counties while adding jobs in Clatsop.
