

#### **Special Topic: Private Firm Size Distribution**




The vast majority of private firms in Coos County have fewer than five employees as of July 2020. These 1,223 firms made up 69.6% of all firms and employed 1,530 workers. At the other end of the size spectrum there were 38 firms with 50 employees or more which were 2.2% of all firms that added 6,755 jobs.


There was not a significant difference in the average quarterly wages paid out by smaller firms compared to larger firms. Firms with fewer than five employees paid an average quarterly wage of \$10,080. Firms with 250-500 employees paid an average quarterly wage of \$13,890.



#### **Special Topic: Private Firm Size Distribution**




The vast majority of private firms in Curry County have fewer than five employees as of July 2020. These 590 firms made up 75.1% of all firms and employed 666 workers. At the other end of the size spectrum there were 11 firms with 50-249 employees which were 1.4% of all firms that added 1,380 jobs.


The average quarterly wage paid out by firms with fewer than five employees was \$9,480. Larger firms in the 100-249 employee category paid around \$5,000 more compared to these smaller firms. Large firms paid an average quarterly wage of 15,810.


