

Coos County, 2021



Location quotients (LQ) are great for comparing regional and national employment compositions. Here, we look at how Coos County's employment concentration compares to the nation's.

If a LQ is near or equal to 1, the industry make up resembles the nation's. If a LQ is greater than 1.25 it indicates a degree of specialization in that industry, while a LQ less than 0.8 indicates the share of employment in that industry is less than the national share.

#### Key takeaways:


Coos County's employment in natural resources and mining was about 3 times the national average share in 2021, with an LQ of 3.27. The second highest LQ was in public work (1.59).

These industries tend to have larger influences on the Coos and South Coast economy.

- Currently hovering near record lows and a tad under its Southern counterpart, Curry.










