

Graph of the Month: The 2024 Job Vacancy Survey for Portland Metro shows that vacancies have decreased to roughly 16,900—mirroring pre-pandemic levels. Most openings are full-time and permanent, with 39% requiring post-high school education and 55% needing prior experience.

- Average starting wages are about \$27.63 per hour.
- 27% of vacancies have been open over 60 days.
- Health care and social assistance accounted for 32% of vacancies.


