Washington County's unemployment rate edged up to 3.0% in September from 2.9% in August. This is 1 percentage point lower than this time last year at 4.0% as well as the historic average (two decades) of 5.8% for Washington County.

While total employment saw a slight gain at 400 jobs, industries were largely divided. Increased employment in sectors like professional and business services or education and health services balanced out against losses in retail trade as well as leisure and hospitality. However, employment remains above pre-pandemic levels and Washington County has more than 10,600 jobs in September 2022 compared with this time last.

The graph-of-the-month comes from the University of Michigan which surveys consumer's feelings around today and tomorrow's economy. Consumer sentiment shifted little from 58.2 to 58.6—close to historic lows. Inflation continues to batter U.S. households current and future expectations of the national economy.




