

HELP WANTED IN OREGON RESULTS FROM THE SPRING 2024 JOB VACANCY SURVEY

OREGON BUSINESSES REPORTED 57,686 VACANCIES IN SPRING 2024.

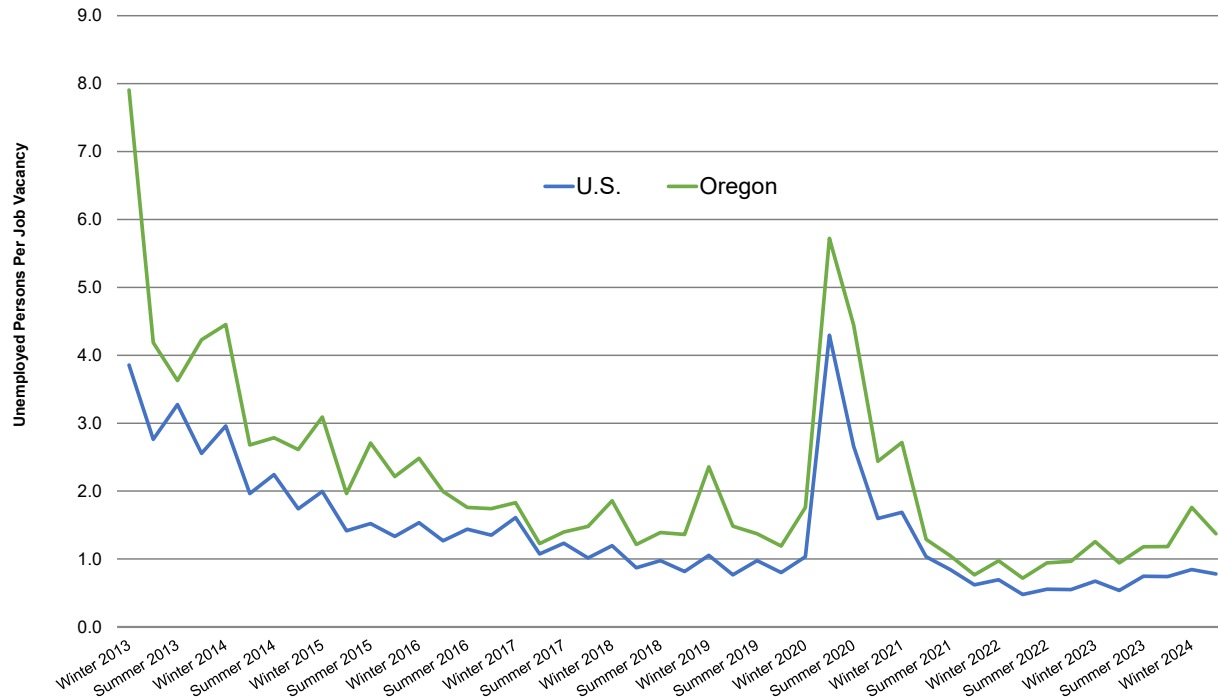
Oregon businesses reported 57,686 vacancies in spring 2024. Vacancies decreased 4% from the winter and decreased 17% from spring 2023. Employers reported difficulty filling 55% of spring 2024 vacancies.

The average starting wage among this group of vacancies was \$26.07 per hour, an inflation-adjusted decrease of 8% from spring 2023, and a 10% increase from winter 2024.

Characteristics of Oregon job vacancies were consistent with prior quarters. A typical job vacancy tends to be for a full-time, permanent position.

AS BOTH UNEMPLOYMENT AND VACANCIES DROPPED IN THE SPRING, THE UNEMPLOYED TO JOB VACANCY RATIO IN OREGON DECREASED.

The U.S. ratio was 0.8 in April 2024, its 12th straight quarter below 1. It reached 4.3 in April 2020 after several years around 1-to-1.

Oregon had 1.4 unemployed per job vacancy in spring 2024, still much lower than the peak of 5.7 in May 2020.

Health care and social assistance had the most vacancies of any industry, with 13,800. Manufacturing had 6,700 vacancies in spring. Leisure and hospitality had 6,400 vacancies.

THE STARTING WAGE FOR JOB VACANCIES AVERAGED \$26.07 PER HOUR IN THE SPRING.

The average starting wage among this group of vacancies was \$26.07 per hour, an inflation-adjusted decrease of 8% from spring 2023 and a 10% increase from winter 2024.

The number of vacancies offering a starting wage below \$20 per hour decreased 19% over the year. The number of vacancies offering between \$20 and \$30 per hour increased 3%, and vacancies paying above \$30 per hour decreased 39%.

Spring vacancies were distributed across the state, with the Portland tri-county area accounting for about 41%.

Vacancies decreased over the year in every region of the state, except the Clackamas and Mid-Valley areas. These regions' vacancies increased by 34% and 22%, respectively.
