Employment in Corvallis MSA (Benton County): December 2024

Benton County's Unemployment Rate Edges up to 3.5%

Benton County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.5% in December, edging up from its revised rate of 3.4% in November. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in December was 4.1%, up from its revised November rate of 4.0%.

Benton County's employment losses in December were less than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased by 20 jobs, when an employment decrease of 100 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased 80 jobs between November and December. Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is now up 3.1% from the level in February 2020, 1,350 jobs above its pre-pandemic level.

Over the past year Benton County's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is up 70 jobs or +0.2%.

The private sector overall shed 70 jobs over the month. Health care and social assistance added 70 jobs. Trade, transportation, and utilities employment increased 30 in December.

Leisure and hospitality employment declined 110 in December. Information, professional services, and other services each shed 10 jobs in December.

The public sector overall added 50 jobs in December. Local government employment increased 50. State government and federal employment were both unchanged in December.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
