Employment in Corvallis MSA (Benton County): February 2025

Benton County's Employment Declines Slightly

Benton County's employment gains in February were less than normal; total nonfarm employment increased by 530 jobs, when an employment increase of 560 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment decreased 30 jobs between January and February. Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is now up 2.0% from the level in February 2020, 850 jobs above its pre-pandemic level.

Over the past year Benton County's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is down 300 jobs or -0.7%.

The private sector overall added 80 jobs over the month. Professional and business services and mining, logging, and construction had the most monthly employment gains.

The public sector overall added 450 jobs in February. Local government employment increased 460. Federal employment was down 10 jobs. State government was unchanged in February.

Benton County's unadjusted unemployment rate was 4.2% in February, down from its revised rate of 4.3% in January. Oregon's statewide unadjusted unemployment rate in February was 5.2%, down from its revised January rate of 5.3%.

Labor force statistics for Oregon metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) are produced by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Through June 2025, seasonally adjusted data are not available for Oregon MSAs or other MSAs around the country. New MSA definitions resulting from the 2020 Census are being incorporated into the history of the data series back to 1990, as well as other updates to the processing of labor force estimates for substate areas. Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
