## **Employment in Columbia County: May 2024**

# Seasonally adjusted employment decreased by 40 in May

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 40 in May to 11,830 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. A gain of 100 jobs was expected for the month, but the county's payroll employment grew by 60. The private sector gained 60 jobs, and government employment was unchanged. Leisure and hospitality added 30 jobs. Other industries had small job changes or were unchanged.

May's total nonfarm employment numbers showed a loss of 220 jobs compared with one year before, a decrease of 1.8%. Some major industries gained jobs over the past year. Private education and health services was up 20 jobs. On the other hand, paper manufacturing was down 200 jobs. Leisure and hospitality and construction were each down 60 jobs. Local education, a component of local government, was down 50 jobs.

Columbia County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9% in May, unchanged from 4.9% in April. It was 4.1% the year before. The statewide unemployment rate was 4.2% in May, and the national rate was 4.0%.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
