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Employment in the Columbia Gorge: March 2024 Job Growth Mostly Positive Over the Year

In March, Hood River County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged up by 0.1 percentage point to 3.0%. Hood River County's unemployment rate ranked as Oregon's second lowest, trailing Wheeler but just ahead of Benton's 3.4%. Over the year, the county's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell by 0.5 percentage point.

Hood River County's nonfarm employment was little changed in March at 12,170 jobs. Private industry edged lower to 10,660 jobs, and government had a total of 1,510. Leisure and hospitality lost 100 jobs and wholesale trade employment slipped by 20 jobs. Manufacturing and government both added 30 jobs over the month.

Hood River County's private-industry employment grew by 130 jobs over the year ending in March, a gain of 1.1%. Leisure and hospitality led private industries with an over-the-year increase of 80 jobs, rising to 2,640. Employment in private education and health services (+70); wholesale trade (+50); and professional and business services (+20) also rose over the year. Local and federal government both added 20 jobs since March 2023.

Wasco County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged up in March to 4.0%, ranking eighth tied with Multnomah and Tillamook counties. Over the year, Wasco County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell by 0.7 percentage point.

Wasco County's nonfarm employment increased to reach 10,280 in March, a gain of 60 jobs. Private industry added 40 jobs, rising to 8,830, while government grew to 2,220, an increase of 20. Leisure and hospitality and private education and health services added 20 jobs each. Government added 20 jobs.

Wasco County's private-industry employment rose by 180 jobs over the year ending in March. Gains were estimated in private education and health services (+80); leisure and hospitality (+30); and professional and business services (+20). Construction lost 30 jobs over the year. Government had a net gain of 80 jobs over the year with increases posted in local (+40), state (+30), and federal government (+10).

Gilliam County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.3 percentage point in March to 5.4%, ranking third highest out of 36 Oregon counties. Gilliam County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 1.9 percentage points over the year ending in March. Gilliam County's nonfarm employment was little changed in March with 805 jobs. Over the year, the private sector lost 55 jobs (-9.2%), while government cut 15, falling to 265.

Sherman County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged in March at 4.3%. Over the year, Sherman County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.6 percentage point. Sherman County's nonfarm employment rose by 50 in March, to 980. Over the year ending in March, private industry added 55 jobs, rising to 645, and government increased its total by 25 to reach 335.

Wheeler County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point in March to 3.0%, ranking as Oregon's lowest. Over the year, Wheeler County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell by 0.2 percentage point. Nonfarm employment was little changed at 365 jobs in March, a gain of five. Over the year ending in March, private industry employment gained five jobs and was estimated at 175, and government rose by 10 to reach 190.

Next Press Releases

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the April county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, May 21st, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for April on Wednesday, May 15th.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
