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Employment in the Columbia Gorge: May 2024 Job Trends Mixed Over the Year

In May, Hood River County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged at 3.2%. Hood River County's unemployment rate ranked as Oregon's second lowest, trailing Wheeler but just ahead of Benton's 3.4%. Over the year, the county's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged up by 0.4 percentage point.

Hood River County's nonfarm employment was little changed in May and was estimated at 11,690 jobs. Leisure and hospitality lost 80 jobs. Job gains were estimated in mining, logging, and construction (+20), and other services (+20). Federal government added 20 jobs over the month.

Hood River County's private-industry employment fell by 370 jobs over the year ending in May, a loss of 3.5%. Losses were seen in retail trade (-190), professional and business services (-60), and manufacturing (-50).

Wasco County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was also unchanged in May at 4.1%, tied with Deschutes and Marion counties. Over the year, Wasco County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.2 percentage point.

Wasco County's nonfarm employment increased by 120 to reach 10,390 in May. Private industry added 110 jobs, rising to 8,180, while government was little changed at 2,210 jobs. Leisure and hospitality (+50), and other services added 30 jobs over the month. Government added 10 jobs.

Wasco County's private-industry employment fell by 30 jobs over the year ending in May. Losses were posted in manufacturing (-40); financial activities (-20); and retail trade (-10). On the other hand, jobs were added in construction (+40); and local government excluding education and tribal (+40).

Gilliam County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged lower by 0.1 percentage point in May to 4.9%, tied for sixth highest out of 36 Oregon counties. Gilliam County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 1.0 percentage points over the year ending in May. Gilliam County's nonfarm employment was little changed in May with 810 jobs. Over the year, the private sector lost 60 jobs (-10.3%), while government employment added 5 jobs to reach 290.

Sherman County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged in May at 4.2%. Over the year, Sherman County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.4 percentage point. Sherman County's nonfarm employment rose by 15 in May and stood at 955. Over the year ending in May, private industry added 5 jobs, rising to 650, and government employment decreased by 10 jobs and stood at 305.

Wheeler County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was flat in May at 3.1%, ranking as Oregon's lowest. Over the year, Wheeler County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.3 percentage point. Nonfarm employment rose by 20 and reached 380 jobs in May. Over the year ending in May, private industry employment gained 10 jobs and was estimated at 185, and government rose by 15 to reach 195.

Next Press Releases

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the June county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, July 23rd, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for June on Wednesday, July 17th.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
