Employment in Douglas County

Douglas County's Unemployment Rate Holds Steady at 5.0% in November

Douglas County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged at 5.0% in November compared with a revised 5.0% in October. The rate is up from 4.8% in November 2023. Douglas County's record low unemployment rate was set in October 2019 at 4.3%. The Oregon seasonally adjusted November rate was 4.1% and the U.S. rate was 4.2%.

Douglas County's seasonally adjusted payroll employment rose by 10 jobs in November after a gain of 60 in October and a gain of 280 in September.

In the not seasonally adjusted private-sector industries in November, there was a seasonal gain in retail trade of 60. There were additional relatively large gains in transportation, warehousing, and utilities (70) and private education and health services (30). There were seasonal losses in leisure and hospitality (-70) and construction (-40). There were additional losses in professional and business services (-30) and manufacturing (-20).

Government dropped 20 jobs in November, due to losses of 10 each in federal and state government.


When comparing November 2024 with November 2023, total nonfarm employment increased 190 jobs, or 0.5%. Private-sector over-the-year gains were seen in manufacturing (130), other services (50), financial activities (40), and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (30). There were relatively large losses in retail trade (-120), professional and business services (-90), and leisure and hospitality (-70).

Government gained 200 jobs over the year from gains in local education (110), federal government (60), Indian tribal (40), and noneducation local government (10). These gains were countered by a loss of 20 in state government.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family w orkers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
