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## **Employment in Eastern Oregon: September 2024**

### **Eastern Oregon Unemployment Rates Remain Comparatively Low**

The September seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased over the year in Baker County, held steady in Wallowa County, and increased in the other four Eastern Oregon counties. Wallowa County's September 2024 rate ties for its lowest September rate since comparable statistics began in 1990. In Baker, Grant, and Malheur counties, they are the second lowest September rates. In Harney and Union counties, only 2023 and 2019 had lower September rates. The seasonally adjusted rate moved 0.2 percentage point lower in Baker County to reach 4.2%. The largest increase came in Grant County where the seasonally adjusted rate rose 0.7 percentage point to reach 5.7%.

Between September 2023 and September 2024, unadjusted unemployment rates held steady in Baker County and increased in the other five Eastern Oregon counties. In Harney (3.6%) and Wallowa (3.2%) counties, the September 2024 rates were the second lowest unadjusted September unemployment rates since comparable statistics began in 1990. Baker County's September 2024 unadjusted rate of 3.7% tied for its second lowest. The smallest over-the-year increase came in Wallowa County, where the raw rate increased by 0.1 percentage point to reach 3.2%. The largest increase came in Grant County, where the raw rate increased by 1.1 percentage points to reach 4.6%.

Baker County's nonfarm payroll employment has decreased by 50 jobs since September 2023. Employment decreased by 70 jobs in the private sector and added 20 jobs in the public sector. Professional and business services led losses, down 90. Private education and health services led gains, up 60 jobs. Total nonfarm employment increased by 80 jobs over the month led by a gain of 130 jobs in local government as schools started back up. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held steady over the month at 4.2%. The raw unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 3.7%.

Grant County's nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 90 jobs over the year. The private sector dropped 120 jobs while the public sector increased by 30. Manufacturing dropped 50 jobs to lead losses. Gains were confined to local government and federal government, up 30 and 10 jobs, respectively. Over the month, total nonfarm employment increased by 50 jobs led by a gain of 90 jobs in local government with the start of a new school year. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.2 percentage point over the month to 5.7%. The raw unemployment rate decreased by 0.1 percentage point to 4.6%.

Harney County's nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 50 jobs over the year. The private sector dropped 50 jobs, and the public sector saw a net change of zero jobs. Losses were led by retail trade, down 40 jobs. Gains were confined to private education and health services and state government, up 20 and 10 jobs, respectively. Total nonfarm employment increased by 30 jobs over the month, led by a gain of 50 jobs in local government. Losses were confined to goods-producing and federal government, down 10 jobs each. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased by 0.1 percentage point over the month to 4.4%. The raw unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 3.6%.

Malheur County's nonfarm payroll employment increased by 120 jobs over the year. The private sector rose by 170, and the public sector dropped 50 jobs. Private education and health services added 70 jobs to lead gains, followed by mining, logging, and construction, up 60. Retail trade and state government also added jobs, each up 40. Local government dropped 70 jobs to lead losses. Total nonfarm employment increased by 40 jobs over the month, with wholesale trade and private education and health services leading the gains, up 40 jobs each. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held steady over the month at 3.7%. The raw unemployment rate decreased by 0.2 percentage point to 3.3%.

Union County's nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 190 jobs over the year. The private sector dropped 190 jobs, and the public sector saw a net change of zero jobs. Manufacturing led losses, down 210 jobs, followed by retail trade, down 50. Construction and private education and health services led gains, each up 50 jobs. Total nonfarm employment decreased by 70 jobs over the month, with construction leading losses, down 30. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held steady over the month at 4.6%. The raw unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.2%.

Wallowa County's nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 20 jobs from September 2023 to September 2024. The private sector dropped 40 jobs, and the public sector increased by 20. Manufacturing led losses, down 30 jobs. Leisure and hospitality led gains, up 40 jobs. Total nonfarm employment decreased by 80 jobs over the month with leisure and hospitality leading losses, down 70. Local government added 60 jobs to lead gains. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held steady over the month at 4.3%. The raw unemployment rate decreased by 0.1 percentage point to 3.2%.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
