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# Employment in Eastern Oregon: December 2024 Eastern Oregon Unemployment Rates Remain Comparatively Low

The December seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased over the year in Baker County, held steady in Harney County, and increased in the other four Eastern Oregon counties. Baker and Harney counties' December 2024 rates are their lowest December rates since comparable statistics began in 1990. In Wallowa and Malheur counties, they are the second and third lowest December rates, respectively. The seasonally adjusted rate moved 0.3 percentage point lower in Baker County to reach 4.1%. The largest increase came in Grant County where the seasonally adjusted rate rose 1.2 percentage points to reach 6.1%.

Between December 2023 and December 2024, unadjusted unemployment rates decreased in Baker and Harney counties, held steady in Wallowa County, and increased in Grant, Malheur, and Union counties. Harney County's December 2024 unadjusted rate of 4.5% was its lowest unadjusted December unemployment rate since comparable statistics began in 1990. In Wallowa County, the December 2024 rate (4.7%) tied with December 2019 and 2023 for lowest December rate. Baker County's raw rate fell by 0.6 percentage point to reach 4.4% for the largest decrease. The largest increase came in Grant County, where the raw rate increased by 1.2 percentage points to reach 6.3%.

Baker County's nonfarm payroll employment has increased by 30 jobs since December 2023. Employment increased by 20 jobs in the private sector and added 10 jobs in the public sector. Retail trade, and private education and health services led gains, up 70 jobs each. Professional and business services led losses, down 60. Total nonfarm employment decreased by 20 jobs over the month led by losses in leisure and hospitality, and federal government, down 20 jobs each. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held steady over the month at 4.1%. The raw unemployment rate rose by 0.7 percentage point to 4.4%.

Grant County's nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 100 jobs over the year. The private sector dropped 20 jobs while the public sector decreased by 80. Local government dropped 50 jobs to lead losses, followed by a loss of 40 jobs in manufacturing. Small gains were spread across several industries. Over the month, total nonfarm employment decreased by 60 jobs led by losses of 20 jobs each in leisure and hospitality, and local government. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point over the month to 6.1%. The raw unemployment increased by 1.1 percentage points to 6.3%.

Harney County's nonfarm payroll employment increased by 50 jobs over the year. The private sector increased by 20 jobs, and the public sector added 30 jobs. Gains were led by other services and local government, up 30 jobs each. Losses were led by leisure and hospitality, down 20. Total nonfarm employment increased by 20 jobs over the month, with small gains in private education and health services, other services, and federal government overcoming a small loss in leisure and hospitality. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased by 0.1 percentage point over the month to 4.2%. The raw unemployment rate rose by 0.8 percentage point to 4.5%.

Malheur County's nonfarm payroll employment increased by 110 jobs over the year. The private sector rose by 160, and the public sector dropped 50 jobs. Manufacturing added 110 jobs to lead gains, followed by private education and health services, and leisure and hospitality, up 40 each. Local government dropped 50 jobs to lead losses. Total nonfarm employment decreased by 70 jobs over the month, led by a loss of 20 jobs in professional and business services. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased by 0.1 percentage point over the month to 3.8%. The raw unemployment rate increase by 0.9 percentage point to 4.1%.

Union County's nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 10 jobs over the year. The private sector dropped 50 jobs, and the public sector increased by 40 jobs. Construction dropped 60 jobs to lead losses, followed by manufacturing, down 50. Private education and health services led gains, up 110 jobs, followed by leisure and hospitality, up 60. Total nonfarm employment decreased by 60 jobs over the month, with local government leading losses, down 30. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased by 0.1 percentage point over the month to 4.7%. The raw unemployment rate rose by 0.8 percentage point to 4.9%.

Wallowa County's nonfarm payroll employment increased by 50 jobs from December 2023 to December 2024. The private sector added 10 jobs, and the public sector increased by 40. Wholesale and retail trade, other services, and local government led gains, up 20 jobs each. Manufacturing led losses, down 20 jobs. Total nonfarm employment decreased by 60 jobs over the month with leisure and hospitality leading losses, down 20. The only industry to add jobs over the month was private education and health services, up 10 jobs. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held steady over the month at 4.4%. The raw unemployment rate increased by 0.9 percentage point to 4.7%.

The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
