Employment in Jackson County: October 2024 Gains in Health Care and Social Assistance Boost Total Employment

Total payroll employment in Jackson County rose by 270 jobs in October. Health care and social assistance (+270) had the largest private-sector gain over the month, and over the past year (+1,030). Gains in October were also estimated in retail trade (+80) and other services (+40). Employment fell over the month in leisure and hospitality (-300), professional and business services (-70), construction (-50), and manufacturing (-40). Government had a gain of 310 jobs over the month with an increase of 390 in local government education slightly offset by a decline of 40 jobs in federal government.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) expanded by 240 jobs, an increase of 0.1%. Since October 2023 industries adding jobs were private education and health services (+1,030), and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+50). Industries with over-the-year losses included retail trade (-520), manufacturing (-350), construction (-150), financial activities (-150), and information (-50).

Government employment climbed by 440 jobs over the year. Local government (+350), federal government (+50), and state government (+40) gained jobs over the past 12 months. Most of the local government gain was in local government education (+220).

Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.6% in October, unchanged from September and up slightly from 4.5% in October 2023.

Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
