## Employment in Jackson County: October 2022 Leisure and Hospitality, and Health Care and Social Assistance Add Most Jobs over the Year

Total payroll employment in Jackson County increased by 770 jobs in October. The largest decline was estimated in leisure and hospitality which lost 350 jobs. Other sectors losing jobs over the month were professional and business services (-40) and federal government (-20). Local government education added 420 jobs in October as school year hiring continued. Other industries with estimated job gains included private education and health services (+180); construction (+60); and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+50).

Over the past year payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) gained 1,710 jobs, an increase of 1.9%. Jackson County is now 1,480 jobs below the October 2019 prepandemic total. Since October 2021, industries adding jobs included health care and social assistance (+680); leisure and hospitality (+500); construction (+470); and wholesale trade (+50). Retail trade (-40) and professional and business services (-100) lost jobs over the year.

Government employment rose by 570 jobs over the year. Local government education had an estimated increase of 460 jobs and state government employment rose by 10. Federal government employment slipped by 30 over the year. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.3% which was down from 4.8% in October 2021.

## Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.
