Employment in Jackson County: December 2022 Health Care and Social Assistance Add Most Jobs over the Year

Total payroll employment in Jackson County was essentially unchanged in December. A few sectors added jobs over the month including leisure and hospitality (+100); private education and health services (+90); and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+50). On the other hand a number of industries shed jobs in December. Those losing jobs were retail trade (-90), construction (-80), manufacturing (-40), other services (-20), and mining and logging (-20). Government employment fell by 60 in December with losses estimated in local education (-30), state government (-20), and federal government (-20).

Over the past year payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) gained 1,730 jobs, an increase of 1.9%. Jackson County is now 1,090 jobs below the December 2019 prepandemic total. Since December 2021, industries adding jobs included health care and social assistance (+740), leisure and hospitality (+670), construction (+400), wholesale trade (+80), manufacturing (+60), and professional and business services (+50). Retail trade (-780), and information (-40) lost jobs over the year.

Government employment rose by 500 jobs over the year. Local government education had an estimated increase of 350 jobs and state government employment rose by 30. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.0 % up slightly from 4.7% in December 2021.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the January county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, March 7th, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for January on Tuesday, March 7th.

Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.
