## **Employment in Jackson County: April 2024 Construction Adds Most Jobs Over the Month**

Total payroll employment in Jackson County rose by 470 jobs in April. Job gains were estimated in most published industries. Employment rose in construction (+130); health care and social assistance (+110); leisure and hospitality (+80); manufacturing (+50); and professional and business services (+40). Government employment also edged up by 50 jobs. Gains were posted in state (+20), local (+20), and federal government (+10). The only published industry losing jobs was retail trade, down by 30 in April.

Over the past year payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) fell by 550 jobs, a decline of 0.6%. Since April 2023, industries adding jobs included private education and health services (+790) and construction (+190). Industries with over-the-year losses were leisure and hospitality (-580); professional and business services (-290); retail trade (-280); manufacturing (-270); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-160); other services (-130); financial activities (-120); information (-60); and wholesale trade (-60).

Government employment climbed by 410 jobs over the year. Local government (+240), state government (+90), and federal government (+80) all gained jobs over the past 12 months. Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.8% in April, edging down from 4.9% in March and up from 4.1% in April 2023.

## Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
