## Employment in Jackson County: May 2024 Leisure and Hospitality, and Retail Trade Add Most Jobs Over the Month

Total payroll employment in Jackson County rose by 630 jobs in May. Job gains were estimated in many published industries. Retail trade (+150), and leisure and hospitality (+140) had the greatest job gains in May. Other industries adding employment were health care and social assistance (+70); construction (+60); financial activities (+30); and professional and business services (+30). Government employment grew by 140 jobs. Gains were posted in local (+80), and federal government (+70).

Over the past year payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) fell by 680 jobs, a decline of 0.8%. Since May 2023, industries adding jobs included private education and health services (+690) and construction (+160). Industries with over-the-year losses were leisure and hospitality (-430); manufacturing (-360); professional and business services (-260); retail trade (-180); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-180); other services (-120); financial activities (-90); wholesale trade (-70); and information (-60).

Government employment climbed by 220 jobs over the year. State government (+90), federal government (+90), and local government (+40) all gained jobs over the past 12 months. Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.8% in May, unchanged from April and up from 4.1% in May 2023.

## Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
