Employment in Jackson County: June 2024 Leisure and Hospitality Adds Most Jobs Over the Month

Total payroll employment in Jackson County rose by 380 jobs in June. Job gains were estimated in leisure and hospitality (+310); private education and health services (+70); and construction (+40). Professional and business services (-50) and retail trade (-20) were the only industries with slight employment declines over the month. Government employment was unchanged in June. A loss of 80 jobs in local government education was mostly offset by gains in state government (+30), and federal government (+20).

Over the past year payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) rose by 160 jobs, an increase of 0.2%. Since June 2023, industries adding jobs included private education and health services (+1,080) and construction (+50). Industries with over-the-year losses were manufacturing (-380); leisure and hospitality (-350); retail trade (-250); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-140); professional and business services (-130); other services (-90); financial activities (-60); wholesale trade (-30); and information (-20).

Government employment climbed by 470 jobs over the year. Local government (+310), state government (+100), and federal government (+60) all gained jobs over the past 12 months. Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.7% in June, little changed from May and up from 4.1% in June 2023.

Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
