Employment in Jackson County: July 2024 Seasonally Typical Declines in Local Education Reduce Total Employment

Total payroll employment in Jackson County fell by 410 jobs in July. Government employment declined by 1,190 jobs, mostly due to 1,280 fewer jobs in local government education in July. Federal (+30) and state government (+10) had small gains. Private sector job gains were broad-based in July. Job totals rose in retail trade (+230); health care and social assistance (+180); construction (+170); and professional services (+120). Gains were also posted in leisure and hospitality (+80), other services (+60), and manufacturing (+30). Transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-20) was the only industry with a slight employment decline over the month.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) rose by 770 jobs, an increase of 0.9%. Since July 2023, industries adding jobs were private education and health services (+1,310) and leisure and hospitality (+100). Industries with over-the-year losses included manufacturing (-290); professional and business services (-180); financial activities (-160); retail trade (-110); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-60); construction (-60); and other services (-30).

Government employment climbed by 270 jobs over the year. Local government (+180), and federal government (+80) gained jobs over the past 12 months. Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.7% in July, unchanged from June and up from 4.2% in July 2023.

Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
