# Employment in Jackson County: November 2024 Total Employment Down Slightly Over the Year

Total payroll employment in Jackson County fell by 390 jobs in November with several industries posting monthly job declines. Leisure and hospitality showed the largest drop, down by 290 jobs. Others with estimated employment losses included financial activities (-90); manufacturing (-60); construction (-50); and professional and business services (-50). A couple industries added jobs in November. Health care and social assistance employment rose by 100, and transportation, warehousing, and utilities gained 40 jobs over the month. Government employment slipped by 110 jobs with losses in local (-70), federal (-30), and state government (-10).

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) dipped by 90 jobs, a decrease of 0.1%. Since November 2023 industries adding jobs were private education and health services (+970); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+70); and mining and logging (+20). Industries with over-the-year losses included retail trade (-500), manufacturing (-260), financial activities (-220), construction (-70), and information (-40).

Government employment rose by 190 jobs over the year. Local government (+110), federal government (+50), and state government (+30) gained jobs over the past 12 months.

Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.7% in November, little changed from October and up slightly from 4.5% in November 2023.

#### Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
