Employment in Josephine County: April 2023 Private Education and Health Services Adds Most Jobs Over the Year

Total payroll employment in Josephine County increased by 140 jobs in April. Industries adding jobs over the month included private education and health services (+50), leisure and hospitality (+50), construction (+20), other services (+20), and manufacturing (+20). Government employment fell by 20 jobs over the month with the loss in local government education (-20).

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) declined by 260 jobs, a loss of 1.0%. Industries adding jobs since April 2022 included private education and health services (+290),other services (+120), and construction (+30). Industries losing jobs over the year were professional and business services (-200), leisure and hospitality (-200), retail trade (-170), manufacturing (-170) and construction (-20).

Government employment rose by 150 jobs over the year. A gain of 140 jobs in local government education, and 20 jobs in state government accounted for the yearly gain. Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.5% in April, down slightly from 6.0% in March and above the April 2022 rate at 4.8%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the May county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, June 21st, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for May on Wednesday, June 14^{th.}

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
