Employment in Josephine County: May 2024 Leisure and Hospitality Boosts Employment Over the Month

Total payroll employment in Josephine County rose by 320 jobs in May. The three industries accounting for most of the change were leisure and hospitality (+120); private education and health services (+70); and retail trade (+40). Other industries showed little change. Government employment increased by 50 jobs with gains in local (+20), federal (+20), and state government (+10).

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) slipped by 190 jobs, a decrease of 0.7%. Industries adding jobs since May 2023 included private education and health services (+320), professional and business services (+100), and financial activities (+20). Industries with estimated losses were leisure and hospitality (-240), manufacturing (-140), retail trade (-110), wholesale trade (-60), and other services (-40). Transportation, warehousing, and utilities lost 70 jobs over the year.

Government employment rose by 50 jobs over the year. State government (+30), Federal government (+10), and local government education (+10) added jobs since May 2023.

Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.4 in May, unchanged from April and up from the May 2023 rate of 4.7%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the June county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, July 23rd, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for June on Wednesday, July 17th.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
