## **Employment in Josephine County: September 2024 Local Government Education Boosts Over-the-Month Job Gain**

Total payroll employment in Josephine County rose by 440 jobs in September. Private-sector industries losing jobs over the month were leisure and hospitality (-60), and construction (-40). Private education and health services gained 30 jobs over the month. Government employment gained 530 jobs with a seasonally typical increase of 560 jobs in local government education slightly offset by losses in local government excluding educational services (-20), and state government (-10).

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) climbed by 150 jobs, an increase of 0.5%. Industries adding jobs since September 2023 included private education and health services (+520); financial activities (+50); and professional and business services (+30). Industries with estimated losses were leisure and hospitality (-190), manufacturing (-80), construction (-70), and retail trade (-40). Transportation, warehousing, and utilities lost 60 jobs over the year.

Government employment rose by 10 jobs over the year. State government (+30), and local government excluding educational services (+10) added jobs since September 2023. Local government education employment slipped by 20 jobs.

Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.5% in September, little changed from August and up slightly from the September 2023 rate of 5.2%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the October county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, Nov. 19<sup>th</sup>, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for October on Thursday, Nov. 14<sup>th</sup>.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
