Employment in Josephine County: November 2024 Losses in Leisure and Hospitality Drop Total Employment Over the Month

Total payroll employment in Josephine County declined in November by 160 jobs. Privatesector industries losing jobs over the month were leisure and hospitality (-140), manufacturing (-50), and financial activities (-40). Private education and health services gained 40 jobs over the month. Both retail trade and transportation, warehousing, and utilities added 20 jobs in November. Local government education employment increased by 20 jobs while federal government and local government excluding educational services each lost 10 jobs.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) increased by 80 jobs, a gain of 0.3%. Industries adding jobs since November 2023 included private education and health services (+520); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+50); and financial activities (+30). Industries with estimated losses were manufacturing (-220); professional and business services (-120); construction (-30); and leisure and hospitality (-20).

Government employment fell by 140 jobs over the year, mostly due to a decline of 140 jobs in local government education.

Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.6% in November, unchanged from October and up slightly from the November 2023 rate of 5.3%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the December county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, Jan. 28th, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for December on Thursday, Jan. 23rd.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
