Employment in Lane County (Eugene MSA)

Lane County Employers Add 500 Jobs in December

Lane County's seasonally adjusted payroll employment increased by 500 jobs in December after no change in November and a loss of 100 in October. The county has regained 83% of the jobs lost in March and April 2020 at the onset of the COVID-19 crisis.

In the not seasonally adjusted private-sector industries in December, there were gains in retail trade (300) and leisure and hospitality (300). There was a loss in professional and business services of 100.

Government dropped 100 jobs in December due to a loss of 100 in local government education.

When comparing December 2023 with December 2022, total nonfarm employment is up a seasonally adjusted 100 jobs, or 0.1%. There were over-the-year gains in private education and health services (1,000), professional and business services (400), leisure and hospitality (400), and construction (300). There were losses in manufacturing (-200) and financial activities (-200).


There was an over-the-year decrease of 2,000 in government due to a loss of 2,200 in local government that was countered by increases of 100 each in federal government and state government.

Lane County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was essentially unchanged at 4.0% in December compared with a revised 3.9% in November. The rate is lower than the 5.1% recorded in December 2022. Lane County's record low rate was 3.5% in December 2019. The Oregon seasonally adjusted December rate was 3.7% and the U.S. rate was 3.7%.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.





The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
