Employment in Lane County (Eugene MSA)

Lane County's Payroll Employment was Unchanged in May

Lane County's seasonally adjusted payroll employment was unchanged in May after an increase of 700 in April and no change in March.

In the not seasonally adjusted private-sector industries in May, there were seasonal gains in leisure and hospitality (600) and construction (100). Elsewhere there were gains of 100 each in financial activities, professional and business services, and private education and health services. There was a loss of 100 in other services.

Government added 600 jobs in May due to gains of 300 in local education, 200 in noneducation local government and 100 in federal government.

When comparing May 2024 with May 2023, total nonfarm employment added 600 jobs on a seasonally adjusted basis for a change of 0.4%. There were over-the-year gains in private education and health services (1,700) and financial activities (200). There were relatively large losses in retail trade (-1,000), professional and business services (-800), other services (-300) and leisure and hospitality (-200).


There was an over-the-year increase of 2,300 in government due to gains in local education (1,700), noneducation local government (400), and state government (200).

Lane County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged at 4.3% in May compared with a revised 4.3% in April. The rate is higher than the 3.7% recorded in May 2023. Lane County's record low rate was 3.5% in November 2019. The Oregon seasonally adjusted May rate was 4.2% and the U.S. rate was 4.0%.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.





The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
