Employment in Lane County (Eugene MSA)

Lane County Employers Add 500 Jobs in June

Lane County's seasonally adjusted payroll employment rose by 500 jobs in June after an increase of 700 in May and no change in April.

In the not seasonally adjusted private-sector industries in June, there were seasonal gains in leisure and hospitality (800) and construction (100). Elsewhere, there were gains of 100 each in manufacturing; wholesale trade; and transportation, warehousing, and utilities. There was a loss of 200 in private education and health services.

Government dropped 300 jobs in June due to a seasonal loss of 400 in local education from the beginning of summer break that was countered by a gain of 100 in noneducation local government.

When comparing June 2024 with June 2023, total nonfarm employment added 1,100 jobs on a seasonally adjusted basis for a gain of 0.7%. There were over-the-year gains in private education and health services (1,800), leisure and hospitality (500), manufacturing (200), and financial activities (200). There were relatively large losses in retail trade (-1,000), professional and business services (-300), and other services (-300).


There was an over-the-year increase of 1,100 in government due to gains in local education (700), noneducation local government (300), and state government (100).

Lane County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was essentially unchanged at 4.2% in June compared with a revised 4.3% in May. The rate is higher than the 3.7% recorded in June 2023. Lane County's record low rate was 3.5% in November 2019. The Oregon seasonally adjusted June rate was 4.1% and the U.S. rate was 4.1%.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family w orkers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
