Employment in Albany MSA (Linn County): January 2023

Linn County's Unemployment Rate Increases to 4.9%

Linn County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9% in January, up from its revised rate of 4.8% in December. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in January was 4.8%, unchanged from its revised December rate of 4.8%.

Linn County's employment losses in January were less than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased by 400 jobs, when employment would be expected to decline 710. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased by 310 jobs between December and January. Employment is now 3.6%, or 1,670 jobs, above the pre-pandemic employment level in February 2020.

Linn County's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is up 1,040 or 2.2% over the past year.

The private sector dropped 720 jobs in January. Industries showing the largest employment declines in January included trade, transportation, and utilities (-580 jobs, -4.8%); construction (-60 jobs, -1.8%); and leisure and hospitality (-30 jobs, -0.8%).

Public-sector employment was up 320 jobs in January. Local government employment added 300. Federal government and state government each added 10 jobs in January.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.



The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
