
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Portland Metropolitan Area: February 2023

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.2% in February, little changed from January (4.1%) and slightly higher than year ago (3.9%). Approximately 61,200 area residents were unemployed; 8,800 more than a year ago. The statewide unemployment rate was essentially unchanged at 4.7% and the national rate rose to 3.6% in February.

Employers added 800 jobs in February following (upwardly revised) gains of 9,400 jobs in January (seasonally adjusted).

Manufacturing and financial activities lost jobs over the month, distributed across most published components. Private educational services and leisure and hospitality each added fewer jobs than typical for this time of year. Strength in professional and business services and construction powered much of February's net gains.



Employment peaked in February 2020 before declining sharply in the first few months of the pandemic. Three years later, the economy has made a full jobs recovery overall. However, broken down by industry, not all sectors are back to pre-pandemic levels. Leisure and hospitality, which suffered the largest losses, has added back tens of thousands of jobs but is still below its pre-pandemic peak (-8,900 jobs, -7.2%). Private educational and health services is down 2.3% (-4,500) with deficits across all published components except ambulatory health care (e.g. doctors' offices). Manufacturing is off by 0.8% (-1,000), pulled down by primary metals (-1,400) and nondurable goods (-1,800). On the positive side, construction (+7,300; +9.7%), transportation and warehousing (+3,700; +7.7%), and professional and business services (+12,600; +6.6%) are all well above prepandemic peaks.

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for March on Tuesday, April 25.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
