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
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## Portland Metropolitan Area: December 2023

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate ticked up to 3.7% in December from 3.5% in November. Approximately 51,900 area residents were unemployed; 5,800 less than a year ago. The statewide unemployment rate was essentially unchanged at 3.7% and the national rate held steady, also at 3.7%.

Employers added 3,200 jobs in December following a nearly identical loss in November (seasonally adjusted). Monthly job growth slowed through 2023, ending the year averaging 1,400; down from 2022 (2,600 jobs) and from the two years prior to the pandemic (1,900).

All but one of the region's 10 broad industries outperformed typical trends for December, led by professional and business services. This large and broad sector added 700 jobs when a small loss is the norm for December. Leisure and



hospitality also exceeded seasonal expectations, due entirely to the eating and drinking places component.

Construction was the only major sector to fall short of typical December patterns, declining by 1,200 jobs, or twice the average, following a similar atypical decline in November.

Over the past 12 months, nonfarm payrolls rose by 16,600 jobs, or 1.3%. Despite recent slowing, construction (7.5%) continues to outpace all other broad industries. Leisure and hospitality is also growing relatively rapidly (4.8%) as it continues to recover from pandemic losses. In contrast, manufacturing hit a slow patch in 2023 and is now down 3.1% over the year (-4,000 jobs) with losses spread across most published components.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
